In 1969, the South Terminal of the Port of Strasbourg became operational along with its first heavy duty gantry crane.

50 years on, the Port has acquired a great deal of expertise in handling heavy loads, both at Strasbourg and at the LRT site at Lauterbourg.


LAUTERBOURG TERMINAL



The gantry crane at Lauterbourg, with a capacity of 220 tonnes, is being fully renovated and will be operational by the end

of the year 2023. The site also has a RORO (Roll on / Roll off) access ramp.

STRASBOURG SOUTH TFRMINAL



RET has the infrastructure, equipment and skills required for heavy lifting:

→ 1 covered river gantry crane up to 460 tonnes

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
- → 1,300-metre long wharf
- → 1 storage and assembly area with a bearing capacity of 70 tonnes/m²
