A BRIEF HISTORY OF A GREAT PORT

Strasbourg was built some distance from the River Rhine, away from its risks of flood and invasion. Sheltered from the main river, the city and its port grew up on the River III. For centuries, the people of Strasbourg lived alongside these tranquil waters.

Then, at the dawn of the 20th century, Strasbourg's ambitions outgrew its existing port, and a new one was built on the banks of the Rhine Far from the heart of the town, it was out of sight and out of mind for the residents of Strasbourg.


